Can remote instruction be utilized as an alternative to traveling for smaller student groups to secondary sites?	Remote instruction cannot be utilized. OPRHP is requesting in-person training at the academy in Rensselaerville.

Additional training requirements for Park Rangers beyond what is required for Security Guard licensing will be provided by OPRHP.

	17	3.2	17	This section states, "To be considered timely, questionnaires filed via the VendRep System require that a vendor certify a questionnaire no more than six months before the due date of the bid." The overall contract of five years will likely be over \$100K. The IFB was released on July 26, 2022, with a due date of September 8, 2022; does not meeting the sixmonth requirement prevent a bid from being accepted and considered?	Vendor Responsibility questionnaire's must be certified within six months of the bid due date.

18	4.26	25	This section makes mention of resumes for any added or replacement staff for continuity and states, "the Contractor will promptly provide resumes of comparably experienced staff for OPRHP's review and approval." Still, we do not find where original staffing resumes are requested. Does staffing, authorized as General Topics Instructors, meet the requirements, if trained by the vendor to the needs of OPRHP's requirements, and are resumes required by all instructional staff?

20	1.5.1	7	Do you realize companies cannot bid on this based upon training in Rensselaerville because you included your right to reserve to hold training anywhere in the state during the five years? How would you suggest this be handled, as the difference in the bid based on location is quite substantial?	Please see Amendment 1.

21	1.5.1	7	The bid as written would require us to bid anticipating our expenses to be at the furthest location from our site, incurring many expenses that would not be charged if the training was limited to Camp Cass. We would have to charge for hotels, gas, food etc to travel. Camp Cass would not include any of these expenses, but it appears we have no choice but to bid it that way, unfortunately. Any remedy to this, would result in a much lower cost to the State. I would suggest, if possible, to redo this RFB to make it possible for companies to determine actual cost.	Please see Amendment 1.
22	1.5.1	7	Are we allowed to present independent bids based upon location and ancillary costs? Or to show the differences between the cost at the different locations.	OPRHP is not seeking alternate bids. Please see Amendment 1.
23	1.5.1	7	What are the circumstances in which Rensselaerville would not be used?	In the case that the Park Police academy in Rensselaerville is not available, OPRHP may use the alternate locations in its sole determination.

Business Automobile Liability Insurance is required anytime the activity might involve a vehicle entering Agency property or if a vehicle is used as part of the service or work provided.

25	4.19	Арр Г	Is there any flexibility regarding the insurance coverage listed? Why are you requiring commercial auto insurance when this training does not involve driving – only to get there? Why are you required to keep insurance for three years after training is completed? These insurance requirements are excessive.	OPRHP declines to make changes to the required insurance.
26	1.5.6	8	Contract section 1.5.6 Training Documentation requires submitting a training manual prior to training. These 3 training curriculums are state approved content. We understand Parks info to be incorporated into the training. What are you expecting as far as a "Manual"? Are you asking for a training manual to be given to each person? Or a training manual for instructors? Please clarify	DCJS training curricula are state-approved minimum content. If vendors intend to use content which has been modified or tailored in any way prior to program delivery, this content must be provided to OPRHP prior to program delivery. Trainees will be given a Park Ranger Patrol guide as part of their training. Vendors are not expected to provide participant or instructor manuals.
27	1.5	7	Did you receive written authorization from DCJC to hold a class with more than 35 students? Do you need two instructors for 50 students in a DCJS approved class? Good instructional practice calls for two instructors for 50 students in a DCJS approved class.	OPRHP has obtained all necessary DCJS authorizations. Vendor should formulate bids based on vendor's understanding of the listed requirements and industry best practices.

28	4.19	25	Are the subcontractors covered under the contractor's insurance or do they need their own coverage?	Should the Contractor engage a subcontractor, the Contractor shall impose the Insurance requirements on the subcontractor, as applicable.
29	1.5	7	Is the service requirement to train 550 park rangers per year?	Service requirements are to train up to 200 Park Rangers per year. There will be overlapping course requirements for each candidate based on their current NYS Security Guard license status.
30		7	Are all the classes to be held between late April and the end of May each year? Could any classes be scheduled outside of that period?	Classes must be held within, and must conclude within the given timeframe.
31			Who is the incumbent vendor?	There is no incumbent vendor.
32			Can we obtain the previous bid prices?	This information is not available.
33		7	Can virtual training, which is now permitted by the NYS DCJS and NYS DOS, be used in some cases in far remote areas outside of the primary training site if needed?	OPRHP declines the request for the contractor to provide virtual training.
34		7	Will OPRHP be assisting in the approval process with DCJS once the required material has been incorporated into the lesson plan?	OPRHP's incorporation of content beyond baseline DCJS materials has been approved by DCJS. Vendor is not responsible for this process.
