IFB Section 4.18 has been amended accordingly.
6			Please confirm weight restrictions for Old Croton Aqueduct area.	The weight restriction for the roads within both Old Croton Aqueduct and Rockefeller State Park Preserve is a maximum of 20,000 lbs.
7			For Old Croton Aqueduct - Can we leave chips on-site permanently?	In most areas of Old Croton Aqueduct, wood chips may be left on-site. There are, however, some sections of OCA which are grass-covered, and in these areas the chips must be removed and disposed of in a designated area as directed by OCA staff.
