## **General Site Overview**



Lake Taghkanic is an approximately 1,700-acre state park in southern Columbia County. Much of the property, including the lake, was donated to the State of New York in 1929 by D. McRae Livingston, with the provision that the lake and park be called Lake Taghkanic. The lake had previously been known as Lake Charlotte. Popular activities at the park today include swimming, picnicking, boating, and hiking on nearly 12 miles of trails.

#### Natural Environment

Set within the Hudson River Valley and Catskill Mountain viewshed, Lake Taghkanic is part of a region known for its rural beauty and sweeping natural vistas. Its setting within Columbia County's pastoral landscape contributes to its scenic charm across the seasons. The centerpiece of the park is its 200+ acre natural lake.

The park provides habitat for many species of plants and wildlife indigenous to this region. Deer, coyotes, beaver, rabbits, squirrels, and raccoons are found in the park, and visitors can fish for large and small-mouth bass, pickerel, brown bullhead, blue gill, and rock bass. In the park's woodlands, Appalachian oak, hickory, maple, cedar, and hemlock are commonly found, with spruce and white birch on the northern slopes.

### **Cultural Resources**

In 1933 a Civilian Conservation Corp (CCC) camp was established at the park, and CCC members constructed the East Bathhouse and Beach, camping areas and cabins, and a stone water tower. Some CCC-era infrastructure at the park, such as the rustic cabins and recreation hall, are still in active use.

#### Recreation

Special features of the park include a tent camping area, cabins and cottages, a bathing beach, picnic areas, boat rentals, playgrounds, and sports fields. A picnic pavilion is also available for rent. Winter activities include ice fishing, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, snowmobiling, and ice skating. Lake Taghkanic is open year-round for day-use activities. Overnight camping is available from May through October.
