Allegany 18 Hiking Challenge



The Allegany 18 is a collection of the 18 original hiking trails in Allegany State Park, totaling 70 miles. Individual packets are available for \$20.00 (includes tax) at the Red House Rental Office, located in the Red House Administration Building
Each packet includes19 maps with interesting information about the trail and a pencil to etch the golden trail markers found on each trail. Once you have hiked all the trails, show the completed maps with etchings to the Rental Office or bring them to a Naturalist to receive your custom Allegany 18 water bottle and sticker.



The Centennial 7 Hiking Program
The Centennial 7 hiking challenge will introduce you to over 20 miles of some of the oldest and newest trails in Allegany State Park. Packets are available for \$14.00 (includes tax) at the Red House Rental Office, located in the Administration Building. Each packet includes 7 maps and a sticker.
