March - Nov

The diverse habitats of NYC support hundreds of species of birds! Study what makes birds unique and why they are important to our ecosystems.

#### Don't Hate, Pollinate

Grades 2nd - 5th

May - Oct

The relationship between plants and pollinators supports life on Earth! Learn about NYC's pollinators and what we can do to protect them.

#### Adapt to Survive

Grades 3rd - 6th
