About the Park

Marsha P. Johnson State Park is a waterfront park located along the East River in Williamsburg, Brooklyn. View remnants of history such as gantry walls, railroad tracks, and cobble stones all surrounded by open green space and pollinator gardens. Formerly known as East River State Park, the park was renamed in honor of transgender TLGBQ+ activist and prominent figure in the Stonewall Uprising, Marsha P Johnson.

Grades 2nd - 5th May - Oct

The relationship between plants and pollinators supports life on Earth! Learn about NYC's pollinators and what we can do to protect them.

Eco Heroes

Level 1: 2nd - 4th, Level 2: 5th - 7th Mar - Nov

Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle! Learn what happens to your waste and what you can do to keep NYC and its waterways clean.

Adapt to Survive

Grades 3rd - 6th May - Oct

Through games and exploring the park, students will learn how animals survive and thrive in their environments.

Grades 3rd - 7th April - Oct

What are estuaries and why are they important? Find out what makes life in NYC's waterways so productive and meet the microscopic critters that support ocean ecosystems.

Grades 5th - 12th Mar - Nov

Explore the impacts of climate change on NYC through hands on activities and participate in stewardship to make a positive impact in your community!

History Stroll

Grades 6th - College Mar - Nov

Learn about the park's namesake, Marsha P. Johnson, as we learn and reflect on LGBTQ+ history in NYC.

Art in the Park

All grades Mar - Nov

From sketching to watercolor to poetry, nature journaling is a key way we can record observations and create deeper connections with our ecosystems.
