## **INSTRUCTIONS**

- Prospective instructors must first complete the 3-hour seminar *Introduction to the New York Safe Boating Course.* Only then may they begin assisting with teaching the 4 courses necessary to meet the instructional requirement for certification.
- The prospective instructor should provide the supervising instructor with a copy of the *Prospective Instructor Application*.
- Applications can be found on the NY Safe Boating flash drive provided to you upon certification, or in the instructor-only area of the NYS Parks website:

www.nysparks.com/recreation/boating/instructors.aspx

- The supervising and prospective instructor should decide in advance of the course which of the chapters the prospective instructor will teach.
- The prospective instructor is required to teach each of the 15 chapters at least once within the 4 courses needed to meet the instructional certification requirement and document that on the evaluation form.
- In addition to filling in the check boxes, supervising instructors should provide written suggestions for improvement and comments to support what the prospective instructor did well. All areas of the evaluation must be filled out. This is a tool to help the prospective instructor become a qualified instructor and to document the process for Marine Services.
