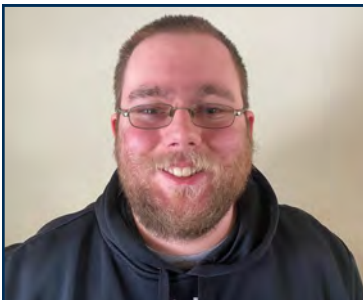
Dallas Brummer

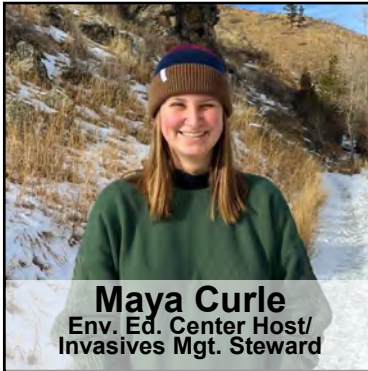
Steven Campbell

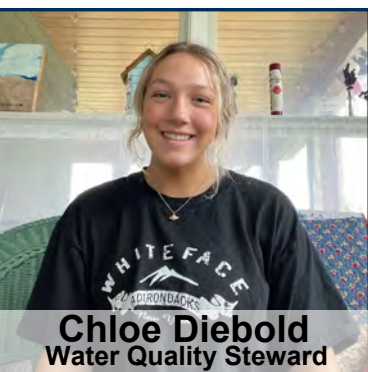
Alyssa Derr

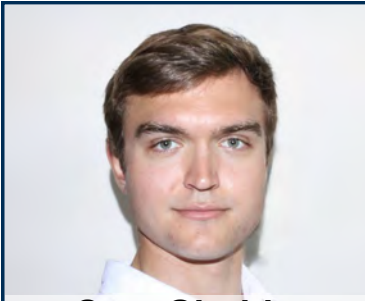
Brian Gantley

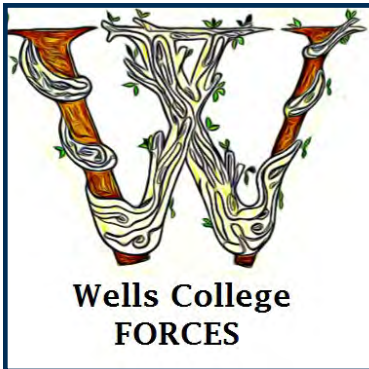
